2021 - 2022 Class Building Parent/Guardian Information

Our goal at École Quadra Elementary is to provide optimal learning experiences for every child. The process of student placement is a complex task which we undertake thoughtfully. The unique needs of all learners are carefully considered as we address a variety of factors. Staff expertise and educational experience with class configuration are the drivers for this work. Our staff do an exceptional job of planning for student success at all grade levels and we appreciate your trust and support as we undertake this process.

Process for Student Placements: The School District allocates staffing based on projections for student enrolment and we always anticipate some changes in the fall. Staff moves, teaching assignments and grade configurations change annually. Configuration of classes must adhere to provincial class size legislation as well as District policy and contractual obligations.

Please note: Class configurations often include "combined" classes of two grades. This is standard practice and is educationally sound. All students work on provincially prescribed curriculum and teachers differentiate instruction for all students.

While we appreciate that specific friendships are important to children, we also acknowledge that getting to know others and learning to work together is a crucial aspect of learning and social development.

Considerations for Student Placement: Once tentative classes are organized, we begin to allocate students to proposed classes. Staff discussions concerning student placements will happen during a number of meetings with teachers, support staff and administration. We carefully consider the following criteria:

- Numbers of students permitted in each class (Collective Agreement / District Policy)
- · Academic needs and learning styles
- Social and <u>behavioural</u> needs
- Previous class placements
- · Provision of support staff working with students with Ministry Designations

In exceptional circumstances, parents may have additional information to share about their child. While parental input is considered, we cannot guarantee parent requests will be met. Please note: Requests for specific teachers cannot be considered or discussed. Thank you for not putting staff in an ethically compromising position by discussing your preferences for your child's classroom placement. Instead, if you have additional information to share about your child, please contact Mr. McCoy directly by May 15th.

spowell@sd61.bc.ca – by May 14, 2021. We will attempt to incorporate your suggestions into our plans. Please note that all of our grade 6 students will attend school at our *Lansdowne South Campus*.

Your letter or email should outline educational reasons, individual needs, and social connections. There will be situations where it will not be possible to accommodate all requests because of the many factors involved in trying to build the best possible educational experience for all students. Among the factors we consider are: peer relationships; the child's social, emotional, physical, and intellectual needs; providing enriched opportunities and support; balancing numbers of students between classes; and trying to create the most advantageous overall educational setting possible for all students. We try to accommodate all requests received by May 14th. It is much more difficult to accommodate any requests received once the class-building process has begun. We will begin class building in May, but all lists will be considered temporary until later in September when we can confirm numbers and staffing.
